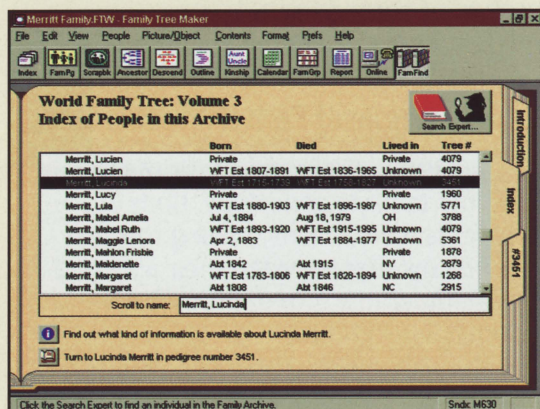

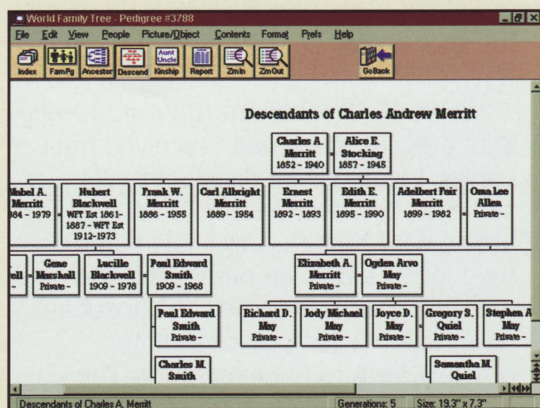

### An Ever-Expanding Pool of Family Trees on CD

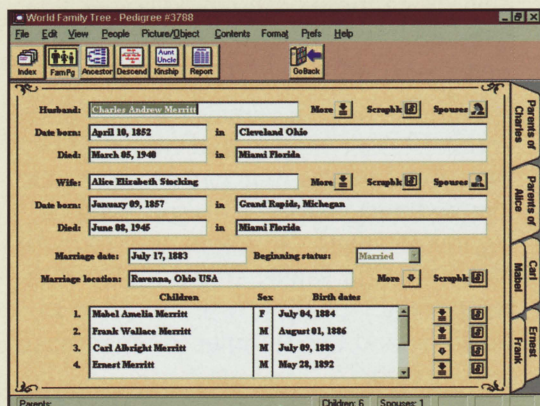
Brøderbund recently released the first 3 Volumes of the World Family Tree on CD-ROM, with many more to follow over time. Approximately 6,000 actual family trees appear on each CD. It's the largest collection of its kind, and the only one you can access with your home computer!

### Convenient Format Does Your Search in Seconds

Each CD has a gigantic index listing every single name that appears in the thousands of family trees it contains. Once you find a relative's name in the index, just one click brings you straight to their entire family tree!

### What You Can Find in a World Family Tree CD

These CDs contain millions of individuals, complete with family links and event dates where known. Some records contain additional source notes and biographical information. With a few simple steps, you can merge World Family Tree pedigrees into Family Tree Maker files, or export them in GEDCOM format.

### Submitter Information Service Helps You Explore More

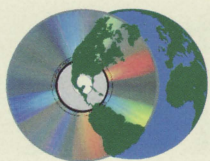

**To Share Your Family Tree:** Save a copy of your file on diskette. Then seal the diskette in a sturdy envelope and send it to Brøderbund Software, World Family Tree Project, P.O. Box 760, Fremont, CA 94537-9924.

**To Order a World Family Tree CD:** Call (800) 474-1933, or write to P.O. Box 6125, Novato, CA 94948-6125. Mention Source code 1012. You can also order World Family Tree CDs from any of Brøderbund's authorized Family Archives resellers.

**System Requirements:** In order to use a World Family Tree CD, you must have a CD-ROM drive and Version 3.0 or higher of either Family Tree Maker™ for Windows® or the Family Archive Viewer. We also recommend an extra 4 MB of hard disk space.

### New England Search Accelerates

"In 1992, I began the task of looking up my family's genealogy. Both of my parents were elderly, having medical problems that impeded their ability to remember much of their respective family background.

On my mother's side of the family, I had been corresponding to Catholic churches in Maine and Canada, trying to establish relationships of several names of people that I thought might be related to my grandfather. This kind of information came back to me very slowly.

When the first edition of World Family Tree CDs came out and I received my copies, I wasn't a bit disappointed. I sent some 23 letters to people in Van Buren, Maine who had the same last name as my mother's maiden name. The first three responses indicated the possibility of a generous jump back in time, possibly back to the late 1500s.
