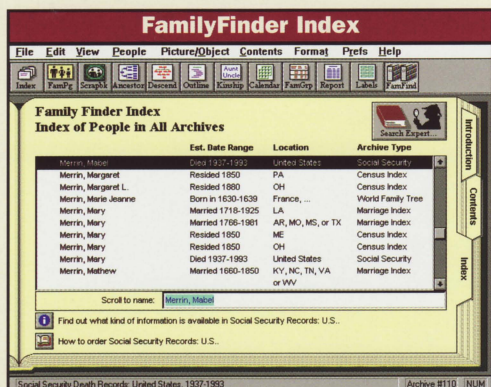


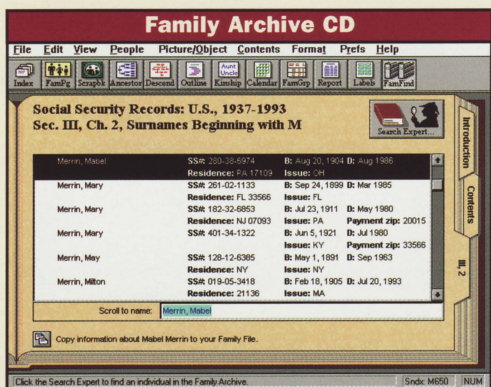

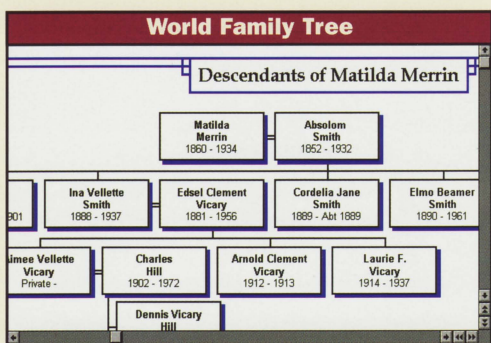

## ▼ What You Can Find on Some of the Most Popular Family Archive CDs

### Social Security Death Benefit Records: U.S., 1937 - 1993 (CD #110)

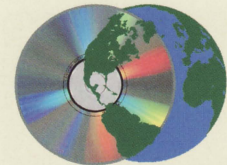
Approximately 55 million names of deceased individuals who received Social Security payments while still living, and whose relatives applied for Social Security Death Benefit payments after the recipient's death. Each entry contains: recipient's name, birth date, death date, Social Security number and the state it was issued by, state of residence at death, zip code of the last known residence, zip code of the address where the death benefit payment was sent, and the Soundex code for the name.

### Marriage Index: IL, IN, KY, OH, TN, 1720 - 1926 (CD #2)

Names of both spouses, along with their marriage date and the county in which it was recorded. Because a marriage marks the junction of two families, Marriage Indexes can reveal information about both the maternal and paternal branches of a family. Also, marriage records are one of the few sources of genealogical information about women of the 1700's and 1800's, when females were not routinely noted by the U.S. Census.

### World Family Tree: pre - 1600 to present (Volumes 1 and 2)

Name, gender, family links, and dates of personal events. Some records also contain free-form text, photos, and further genealogical notes and sources. All World Family Tree pedigrees can be exported as GEDCOM files. In the interest of privacy, the World Family Tree excludes information about living individuals *except for* their name, gender, and family links.
