NEW FEATURES FOR ORG(tm) VERSION 1A

A) There is now a choice for paper length when you configure your system (see User's Guide pages 2-5 through 2-8). The paper length selection appears immediately below the choice for paper width on Configuration -- Page 2.

Note: The paper's width is the measurement horizontally across the page as it sits in the printer. Paper length is the opposite dimension.

B) When printing a chart (User's Guide page 3-14), you can now tell Org to make the chart as wide as necessary. To accomplish this, choose UNLIMITED when Org asks, What size chart do you want?

Org next offers you advanced formatting choices:

- * Vertical List at Lowest Level -- Yes or No
- * Abbreviate at Lowest Level -- Yes or No
- * Use Small Type Font -- Yes or No
- * Overlap Printing of Pages -- Yes or No

By answering yes to any of the the first three choices, you will make the printed chart smaller. You can make any choices you want.

Generally, you should overlap printed pages if you will be taping them together. This will make them easier to assemble. If you intend to print the chart using a program like Sideways, you should not overlap the pages.

Your chart can be as tall as the paper in your printer. If the chart is taller than the paper length you specified when configuring Org, you will receive a message asking if you want your chart trimmed.

- C) There is a new command -- Options -- which can be chosen from the command menu or by pressing Alt-F7. This command allows you to specify a special printed box (starred, dashed, or none -- solid is standard).
 - 1. Place the cursor on the position you want to assign a special box.
 - 2. Select Options. Org will ask what box type you want.
 - 3. Make your choice and press Enter.
- D) Note: Charts prepared using Org Version 1 can be used with Org Version 1A, but the reverse is not true.
- E) The Org diskette also contains a program named README. This program contains additional information about Org and about printer support. This information is not essential to using Org, but you may find it useful if you are having a printer problem or if you want to do something special.

You can read this additional information by placing the Org diskette in drive A:, typing README at the DOS prompt A>, and pressing Enter. Or you can print the information by turning on your printer (with continuous forms), putting the disk in drive A:, and typing PRINTDOC at the DOS prompt A>.
